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

We worked closely with the GOP from the beginning

- Assessed health system strengths and weaknesses
- Identified constraints and interventions
- Identified solutions and presented to DOH for consensus
- No parallel infrastructure



When we started, there was limited evidence-based decision-making


- Provincial and DHIS performance reports were not available
- Data accuracy was less than 50% at DOH facilities
- Data use was limited
 - No HR and monitoring and supervisory system
 - District level health budgets were increased as a
 flat rate

M&E dashboard ranks districts based on key performance indicators in 3 areas











District ranking based on KPIs



Allows district managers to see individual district performance




Two way accountability: lady health workers











Increase in health facilities reporting complete, accurate, and timely monthly reports
